New flag - Donation realized: P Potential donor

When registration of a new deceased donor is made in the database, the donor record is born with the default value 'P - Potential donor' in the field 'Donation realized'.

Potential donor (Donation realized: P - Potential donor)

A person whose clinical condition is suspected to fulfill brain death criteria, but is not (yet) accepted as a donor.

Eligible donor (Donation realized: N - No):

A medical and clinical suitable person who has consented to donation and has been declared dead based on neurological criteria as stipulated by the law of the relevant jurisdiction. However, no organs have been retrieved for the purpose of transplantation, due to clinical conditions. Incision might have been made.

Actual donor (Donation realized: Y - Yes):

Every donor from whom at least one solid organ has been retrieved for the purpose of transplantation, but no solid organs/micro organs have been used for transplantation.

Utilized donor (Donation realized: Y - Yes):

An actual donor from whom at least one solid organ was transplanted.
