'All recipients' implemented

One of the most essential parts of Scandiatransplant has now been converted, tested and implemented to the new user interface. The module covers; registration of patient information, waiting list administration (entry/active/on hold/withdrawal) and STAMP/LAMP.

Two new manuals are available

The new module will run parallel in production with the old user interface for some time, however we encourage you to start using it to get familiar with it.

If the old system on the old servers breaks down, the new system can be up and running against the new virtual servers in a matter of minutes. Therefore, you need to be prepared.

Updated guidelines

Transmission of infectious diseases between donor and recipient

The guidelines for prevention of transmission of infectious diseases from organ donors to recipients have been updated:

- Hepatitis B and C section has been clarified
- Anti-CMV IgG test has been moved to the section 'Samples taken before donation but analyzed later'
- Ebola risk is now included in the section 'Addendum', the text follows the EU guidelines
