#### Report

I was doing the internship at the Helsinki University Hospital in the renal and pancreatic transplantation department. Every morning started with the radiology meeting, where mainly CT and MRI scans of patients with various liver and biliary diseases were discussed, as well as preoperative images of surgery patients, including images of living kidney donors. Every day after the meeting there was a ward round and regular visit to patients. Mostly there were patients, who have recieved a kidney or pancreatic transplant, but also a patients who were hospitalised due to infection, postoperative complications (for example ureteral stricture) or for specifying diagnostics. The visits included conversation and examination of the patients, looking over the current treatment and assigning further laboratory analyses or radiological imaging/procedures if needed.

Every day there was an outpatient clinic, where the most common patients were postoperative followups. The living donor candidates were also assessed at the outpatient clinic (thorough examinations of the donor's general state of health and the safety of kidney donation).

Besides attending to surgeries, inpatient- and outpatient care I participated in weekly meetings, where the applications of kidney transplant candidates received all over the Finland were reviewed and evaluated. Once to twice a month there were meetings with the living donor coordinators, nephrologist and immunologist.

- Multiple organ procurement from a DBD donor
- Living-donor laparoscopic nephrectomy
- Living donor renal transplantation
- Cadaveric renal transplantation
- Simultaneous pancreas and kidney transplantation
- Liver transplantation
- Transplantectomy (kidney)

Observed procedures:

- Multiple organ procurement from a DCD donor
- Living-donor laparoscopic nephrectomy
- Peritoneal dialysis catheter placement

#### **Evaluation**

During my internship at the Helsinki University Hospital, I had the invaluable opportunity to see how a high volume transplantation center is built and driven. This experience provided me with a profound understanding of the challenges and triumphs that accompany the transplantion process. I actively engaged in various aspects of patient care and surgical procedures. I eagerly attended departmental meetings, workshops, and educational sessions, which deepened my understanding of the transplantation process and the broader healthcare landscape.
